The Key Monastery, or Kye Gumpa, is a beautiful Tibetan Buddhist monastery located in the Himalayas, at 4166 meters high in the Spiti Valley. Situated in a remote, yet magnificent valley, this religious training ground for Buddhist Lamas was founded by Dromtön in the 11th century and is still actively used today.
